Research

Dissertation: The Relationship of Emotional Intelligence and Differentiation of Self with Intimacy - This study investigates the relationship of Emotional Intelligence (EI) and differentiation of self with perceived intimacy. Despite the popularity of EI in the popular press, little has been researched linking EI to everyday intimate relationships. EI (as measured by the MSCEIT) is a set of emotional abilities consisting of emotional awareness, emotional understanding, facilitation of emotions with thought, and the management of emotions. Differentiation of self (DOS) (as measured by the DSI) is a Family Systems Theory which describes a process of integrating thinking and feeling systems on an intrapersonal basis and of balancing conflicting needs of separateness and togetherness on an interpersonal level. Intimacy (as measured by the PAIR) is defined as a desire for closeness and bonding that comes from knowing, being known. Integrating the theory of DOS, EI fosters intimacy by managing anxiety and emotional reactivity to increase a sense of closeness in intimacy. Multiple canonical correlations and bivariate correlations were conducted to assess the relationship between EI with DOS, DOS with intimacy, and EI with

intimacy. Results from this study support that the hypothesis of a positive relationship between EI, DOS, and Intimacy. Total EI was related to Total DOS and to Total Perceived Intimacy and to DOS emotional Cut-off variable as well as to Sexual, Intellectual and Recreational intimacy but was not related to Emotional Intimacy. The DOS variable of Emotional cut-off (EC) was found to be a particularly significant variable related to all forms of perceived intimacy. Increased emotional fusion with others (FO) was found to be inversely related to intimacy suggesting that some level of emotional fusion is related to intimacy. EI and DOS combined accounts for 98% of the shared intimacy variance. Furthermore, consistent with sex differences in emotions, sex was a moderating factor between these three concepts. Sex was not a main effect or an interaction between EI and DOS. Women taking an I-Position did account for an interaction between DOS and intimacy. Women engaging in emotional-thinking systems integration also positively impacted the interaction of EI and Intimacy. Men managing emotions positively impacted the interaction of EI and intimacy.
